

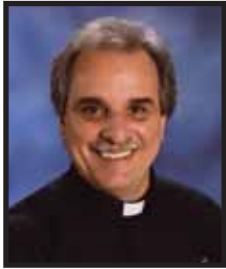

New Changes Within Our Sacred Liturgy Begins on the First Sunday of Advent

There will be information in the upcoming bulletins on the new translation and ongoing formation on the Eucharist. Many of you may have already heard that the prayer texts of the Mass are changing. Well, yes, they are. However, the ritual itself will not change. Imagine a church building made with Lego blocks where the roof blocks are brown. Then you decide to make the roof black; you replace some of the blocks, however the structure and vision remains the same. The structure of the Mass is remaining, some words are changing. The changes will take effect the first Sunday of Advent 2011. This will give us plenty of time to catechize and invite you to fully understand where the changes are occurring. Starting next week we will have a weekly information column regarding the changes.

32 Bicyclists from Baltimore, MD To Join Us for an Evening on Their Way to San Francisco in Their Fundraising Effort for Cancer

We will be hosting a young group of college-aged bicyclists will be traveling through Farmington on **Wednesday, June 15th**. They will arrive in town at about 4:30 pm and depart at 7:00 am the next morning. The **4K for Cancer** runs the nation's oldest university-based cross-country bicycle trek. Each summer, students from universities all across the country undertake a two-month bicycle trek from the Inner Harbor of Baltimore, Maryland to the Golden Gate Bridge of San Francisco, California. The 4,000-miles that the riders cycle is a fundraiser for cancer research, thus giving it the "**4K for Cancer**" name.

My sincere thanks to **Kathy Dziewa** and several of her sorority sisters who will be hosting a dinner for these young bicyclists. The 4K cyclists will be staying overnight in our gym but will be making a small trek for showers at "**Al's Place**", the bicycle hostel here in Farmington that is dedicated to the memory of Kathy's late husband **Al Dziewa**, who was a dedicated cyclist.

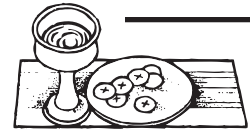

Pentecost Sunday Universal Translator

I once wished that if I could have a special gift from the Holy Spirit, it would be one that the disciples in the first reading apparently had: the ability to speak in my own language, but be understood by people of any language. Like the Universal Translator that let the crew of the starship Enterprise understand alien races, I'd be able to talk to anyone around the world. But the story of Pentecost has a deeper meaning.

Remember that the disciples had been afraid to be seen in public after Jesus' death. After the resurrection, they began to be filled with the Holy Spirit. They began to understand the meaning of Christ's death and resurrection. They began to have the courage to talk about all this to others. Between that courage and their overwhelming joy that Jesus was raised, they could not help but spread the news.

Part of their joy came from the realization that this Good News was meant for all people. Everyone knows that they will someday die, but how many believe or even know about the resurrection? Everyone has sinned at some time, maybe many times, but how many know that Jesus' death takes away our sins? Poor people need to be free from despair, rich people need to be free from their reliance on material goods, powerful people need to be free from their desire to control others, and the sick and suffering need to know that Jesus is with them in that suffering.

Because people from any culture have these needs, they were able to understand the disciples who preached Jesus risen from the dead. The power of the Holy Spirit opened their hearts to the message that could change their lives. And that power is what touches people today. So how do I spread the news? Do I love Jesus enough to share that love with others? Do I show others patience and forgiveness instead of anger? Do I comfort the sick, or avoid them? Maybe I could change my wish to a prayer for the gifts of the Spirit that can best help those around me.

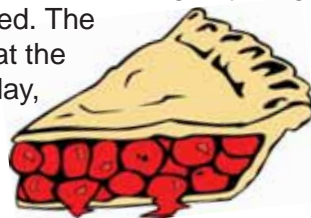
