(John 20:21)

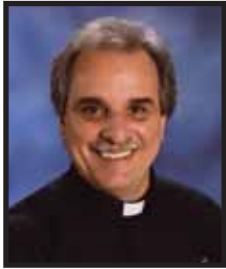
Make these men and women

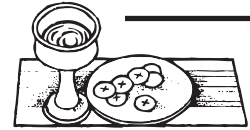

Faith is the Key

Before Jesus died on the cross, he promised his disciples he would not leave them as orphans. He knew how much it would hurt them to see him die, and that they would feel abandoned. He also knew that he had to die for them, so he could rise again. Today's gospel gives another reason he had to die: that he could be with us in a better way.

For Jesus, dying meant that the world would not see him any longer. While he was alive, anyone could see him physically - at least, anyone in that part of Israel at the time. After he died and rose from the dead, we would only see him with the eyes of faith. The advantage to this, however, is that people anywhere in the world and any time in the future could see him that way.

In fact, Jesus can live in anyone, along with the Father and the Holy Spirit. That is what it means when the gospel says that Jesus would send the Spirit (Advocate) to be with us always. It is the meaning of that mysterious verse John 14:20. Jesus is one with his Father and they live together in us who believe. But the key is believing.

In John's gospel, the "world" refers to those who do not believe in Jesus. The world does not accept the Spirit, who is so active in the lives of believers. But believers see Jesus in many ways. We see him in the Scriptures, when we read them privately or hear them proclaimed in the Eucharist. We see him in the sacraments, especially when receiving him in communion, but also when we celebrate his forgiveness in the sacrament of Reconciliation, his healing in the Anointing of the Sick, or the gifts of his Spirit in the sacrament of Confirmation. And the sacraments help us see Jesus in other people: in the lives of a couple united in Matrimony, in our deacons, priests and bishops through Holy Orders, and even in a new baby or a convert at their Baptism.

While the key to this is believing, it doesn't start there. Long before we begin to believe, God offers to live in us through his Son Jesus with the Holy Spirit. If we choose to believe and open the door to God's gifts, we receive love that began before the world was created.

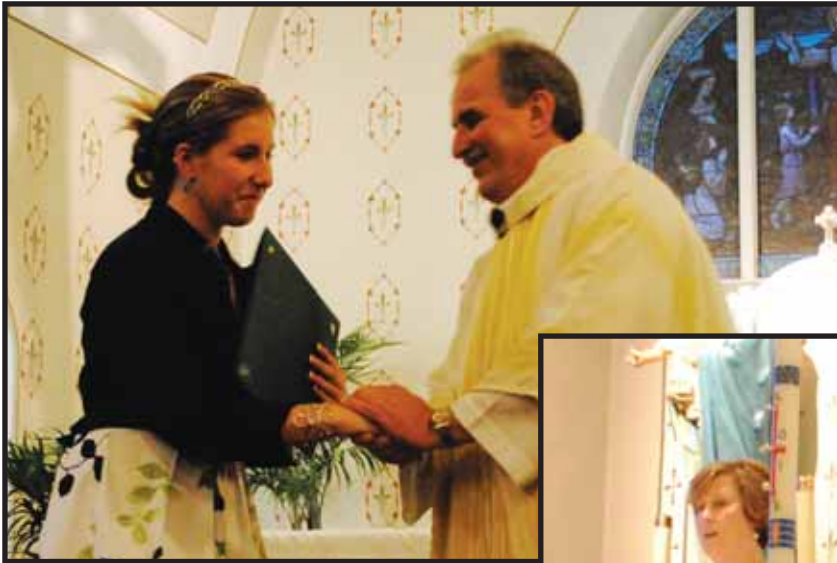

Winning Essay of Knights of Columbus Council 12332 Award



"The Responsibility of the Catholic Citizen in a Free Society" by Brooke Lappe

Catholic citizens in a free society have the responsibility to speak out for the rights of all people: the poor, the oppressed, the elderly, and the unborn. It is our responsibility to work for the common good of all people – to vote for representatives who will pass legislation which furthers the rights of all people. We can have an influence on people by what we say – good or bad. We can help people make good decisions in all aspects of their lives: work, religion, and family. We have the responsibility to make the world a better place.

Our responsibility is to act as Jesus did. Our actions can influence others, too. When we do good things it causes others to do good things, too. Then it creates a cycle, but it starts with you. Our responsibility helps mold us into who we are, and helps us decide what we do, think, and believe.

A huge responsibility we have as Catholics is to respect others, but most importantly to respect ourselves. We need to respect everyone: the elderly, the sick, the young, men, women, children, people from different countries, religions, etc. We can respect others by not calling them by mean names, or doing anything violent to hurt them. We can listen to people, and use common courtesy with them. We can respect ourselves by taking care of ourselves. Why do we need to take care of ourselves? Well, God created all of us in His image, so when we disrespect ourselves we are disrespecting God. Think of your body as a vessel that God lives in. We would want to keep something so holy, so special in good condition. So we need to eat healthy, get good exercise, and stay away from drugs and excess amounts of alcohol. But it is not just our physical bodies that need to be taken

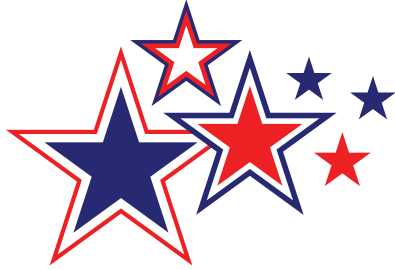
care of; it is our spiritual bodies also. We need to take care of our spiritual bodies so we can stay close to God. We can do this by attending weekly Mass, going to confession, and praying. Respecting ourselves and others is a very important responsibility.

Another important responsibility we as Christians have is to obey Catholic law and listen to Catholic teachings. The Precepts of the Church are important reminders that we are called to grow in holiness and serve the Church. They help us to see that loving God and others is connected to a life of prayer, worship, and service. They guide our behavior and teach us how we should act as members of the Catholic Church. The Precepts of the Church help us to know and fulfill our responsibilities as members of the Catholic Church. They help us unite as followers of Jesus Christ. They make all Church members more aware that the Church is one, holy, catholic, and apostolic. We, also, as Catholics are expected to continue reading the teachings of God, even after receiving our Confirmation. Reading the teachings helps us to become close to God and more like God.

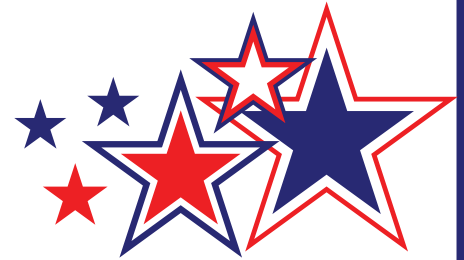
Prayer is the most important responsibility of Catholics. In personal, private prayer we can say anything we want to God. We can pray anytime, anywhere, for any amount of time. Simply thinking about quiet, grace-filled thoughts about God or saying the holy name of Jesus quietly to ourselves is prayer. Praying alone is good preparation for liturgical prayer because private prayer helps us to become aware of the presence of Christ in our lives.

Catholics have responsibilities in the Catholic Church that help us become better citizens, and build better parishes, and make the world a better place.
